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PUBLIC NOTICE

Subject: Procedures and guidelines to obtain CAR 66 AME licence issued by the DGCA.

- Rule 61 of Aircraft Rule 1937, specifies the minimum requirements for issue of AME licence under various categories, the privileges.
- CAR 66 – Details the requirements for initial issue and additional categories of licences in terms of Age, knowledge, Experience and skill.
- An applicant for grant of AME Licence:-
 - must have passed 10+2 examination in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.
 - must be at least 18 years of age.
 - required to demonstrate by examination, a level of knowledge in the appropriate subject modules conducted by Central Examination Organization of DGCA. The content of the examinations vary both in range and complexity according to the licence category being sought.
 - required to demonstrate 3/5 years of minimum experience on operating aircraft as per category/ sub category of AME licence.
 - required to undergo type training including On Job Training.

- The experience requirements may be reduced under the provision of Rule 61 in respect of an applicant who has satisfactorily completed training in a training organisation approved under rule 133B or who has acquired a Degree in Aircraft Maintenance or Degree in Engineering from a recognised University.
- ‘CAR 66 Aircraft Maintenance Engineer’s Licence Guidance Document” attached as **Appendix-A of AAC 4 of 2017** explains the requirements for obtaining CAR 66 AME licence issued by DGCA, procedures for documentation of OJT tasks and maintenance of OJT records.
- Airworthiness Procedures Manual Chapter 17 details the procedures for issuance of AME licences.
